The Maasai certainly know how to celebrate. At our recent visit to the Mara, Pola, Nigel, a fellow trustee, and myself were invited to the opening of the new dormitory at Mara Rianda Primary School.



The whole school, local community, heads from other schools, local politicians and dignitaries, the pastors and the beautifully attired 'mamas' were all in attendance. We were adorned with Maasai clothes, together with a beautiful dress made for Pola.

Speeches were made, and we were showered with gratitude and gifts. I was given a very prestigious shield and spear, which I did manage to bring home. A calf was cooked and a special Maasai soup made. Nigel was the only brave one of us to taste this, and he survived. The gratitude and praise for the dormitory, and the charity for funding the building of it, was immense and very humbling.











No Maasai celebration is complete without singing and dancing by the boys and girls.

The boys gave a demonstration of traditional Maasai dancing in their traditional dress.

The girls' choir sang beautiful songs to everyone. One in particular was about the importance of educating girls. Nigel and Dominic Grammaticas, of Governors' Camp, were presented with shuka's (blankets) and rungu's (beaded sticks) by Peter the headmaster. None of what the Charity has achieved over the years could be done without the enormous support from Governors' Camp.


The dormitory is for 160 girls, comprising of two large rooms, a matrons' room, toilets and showers. Extra sinks were needed and during our trip to Narok we went shopping and bought more sinks! A generous donation was received for the 80 bunk beds and 160 mattresses in memory of Christine, a close friend of the donor. It is very difficult for us to receive the gratitude of the community when projects such as the dormitory are due to your generosity and support. It really is appreciated and life changing.



We recently had an email from one of our past students who was supported at secondary school by the Charity. Gideon left secondary school in 2012. He received further support which enabled him to go to university, although this was not funded by the Charity. He graduated and qualified as a teacher and is currently teaching at a secondary school.
